COA General Session: Donna Lopiano



Donna Lopiano is currently the Executive Director of the Women's Sports Foundation. According to The Sporting News, she is listed as one of the "100 most influential people in sports." She received her Bachelor's degree from Southern Connecticut State University and her Master's and Doctoral degrees from the University of Southern California. She has been a college coach of men's and women's volleyball, women's basketball and softball. She is a member of the National Sports Hall of Fame and is currently a member of the United States Olympic Committee executive board.

As an athlete, she participated in 26 national championships in four sports and was a nine-time All-American at four different positions in softball, a sport in which she played on six national championship teams. She previously served as the University of Texas Director of Women's Athletics (17 years) and as President of the Association for Intercollegiate Athletics for Women. She is a frequent public speaker and columnist to a variety of industry publications, including Street and Smith's Sports Business Journal.


