Pachanga's success as well as Mohegan Sun's has led to other Native American construction contracts and positioned PBC as the leading builder of Native American hospitality and gaming projects.

PBC is currently building five Native Americanowned projects; two for the Seminole Tribe of Florida, while the Pala Resort, Chumash Casino Consolidation Project and Thunder Valley Casino are being constructed in California. Thunder Valley, owned by the United Auburn Indian Community, is on an aggressive eight-month fast track construction schedule. When complete, it

Thayaparan guided PBC through an intense sixmonth standardization process. The entire company now uses Prolog with more than 100 customized reports. PBC often has 10-15 simultaneous gaming projects all over the United States and now Mexico, costing \$50 million - \$1 billion each. Keeping track of so many large-scale projects was proving an arduous task for the PBC management team.

PBC's customizations included a reduction in offline Microsoft® Excel spreadsheets to support cost tracking. With Prolog, PBC project managers have automatic flysheet processing. Thayaparan estimates that PBC has saved close to 10,000 hours using Prolog for cost tracking, and immeasurably reduced multiple data-entry and data-entry error.

Customized reports range from transmittals and RFIs, submittals, cost reports and meeting minutes, to commitment reports. Such detailed reporting
